• Old Dominion ends the regular season with two-straight road games, beginning this Saturday at App State. ODU and the Mountaineers kickoff at 2:30 p.m. on ESPN+.

• ODU is coming off a 37-3 loss to James Madison, while App State lost 28-21 at Marshall.

• Linebacker Jason Henderson recorded 18 tackles to push his nation leading total to 166. He has 49 more tackles than the second leading tackler in the country. Saturday against JMU, Henderson broke the Sun Belt Conference single-season record. He is 28 tackles from breaking the FBS single-season record set by Texas Tech's Lawrence Flugence in 2002. Flugence set the record in 14 games. He can also break the single-season record for tackles per game. Boston College's Luke Kuechly holds the record with 15.9 in 2011. Henderson is currently at 16.6 per game.

Ricky Rahne

Thurmond Family ODU Head Coach
Cornell, 2002
Second Season/Third Overall

Ricky Rahne is in his third season overall and prepares for his second season on the field as head football coach at Old Dominion.

In his first season on the field in 2021, Rahne took a team that went 1-11 in 2019, and did not play in 2020, to a bowl game. ODU started the season 1-6 and won five-straight behind Rahne's 1-0 mentality, to earn a bid to the Myrtle Beach Bowl to play Tulsa. ODU became just the third team since 1936 (AP Poll era) to start the season 1-6 or worse and win six games.

Rahne helped lead Zack Kuntz to first-team All-Conference USA honors at tight end and 12 additional Monarchs to spots on the C-USA honorable mention team. Kuntz finished second in the country among tight ends with 73 receptions, while running back Blake Watson became the first ODU running back since 2016 to rush for over 1,000 yards and finished 22nd in the country with 101.1 yards per game.

ODU had its best scoring defense since 2016 and tied a school record by allowing 20 points or less five times. Linebacker Jordan Young broke the 100-tackle barrier for the first time in his career and set the ODU career record for tackles with 350. The Monarchs finished third in Conference USA and 35th in the country in rushing defense.

Rahne has built the Monarchs on being aggressive on the field and that was epitomized by the special teams units. ODU tied for the national lead with four blocked punts and six total blocked kicks. LaMareon James finished the season ranked ninth in the country with a 29.4 yard average on kickoff returns, and was one of two players to have two, 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns.

During ODU's winning streak, the Monarchs outscored teams by a 36-22 margin, and became bowl eligible in the regular season finale, dispatching Charlotte 56-34.

Rahne was the offensive coordinator at Penn State for two seasons and on the Nittany Lions coaching staff for six years.

For the past nine years, Rahne (pronounced ronnie) has developed an increasing national profile as a key component of Coach James Franklin's staff at both Penn State and Vanderbilt. The coaching staff has guided those teams to bowl games in each of the nine years and have won nine or more games in six of the last eight seasons.

"First, I love Ricky and his family. This is a bittersweet moment for our program. I am so incredibly proud of Ricky and I am super excited for him, his family and Old Dominion," Penn State head coach James Franklin said. "I am forever indebted to Ricky for his loyalty and drive in helping us succeed at Vanderbilt and Penn State. Ricky is a rising star in the industry and is built for this opportunity. He is a smart, open-minded and talented coach. His humble leadership style will resonate well with Old Dominion's leadership and players. I look forward to following his program at Old Dominion!"

"I want to thank President John Broderick for his involvement throughout the search process and his continued overall support for ODU athletics. He was a tremendous asset during the search process meeting at length with each of the final candidates and helping them understand the culture of ODU," Selig said. Rahne spent six seasons at Penn State, including the last two as offensive coordinator. Despite having a new starting quarterback, Rahne helped lead the Nittany Lion offense to 34 points per game this season, while six offensive players earned All-BIG TEN honors this season.

Known as a terrific offensive mind that can adjust to his personnel, Rahne demonstrated that again in 2019. Despite the loss of the No. 2 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft (Saquon Barkley), Penn State rushed for the most yards per game in the last 10 years at 204.9. PSU had nine players earn all-conference accolades, and the Nittany Lions led the Big10 with 42 red zone touchdowns, good for 16th in FBS.

Rahne was the quarterbacks coach in four of his six seasons at Penn State, as both of the quarterbacks he worked with were drafted into the NFL. In 2015, Christian Hackenberg (Jets, 2016) became the all-time leader in career yards passing with 8,457 yards. Three years later, Rahne guided Trace McSorely (Ravens, 2019) past that mark in 2018 with 9,899 yards. He also coached the tight ends in 2016 and 2017, guiding Mike Gesicki who was drafted by the Miami Dolphins.

Penn State has played in a bowl game in every year Rahne was there, including a 2016 Big10 Championship and 2017 PlayStation Fiesta Bowl win over Washington. In that time, Penn State has had four-straight seasons of at least nine wins, and the Nittany Lions are one of five teams to rank in the Top-15 of the College Football Playoff final rankings in each of the last four years.

Prior to joining Penn State, Rahne was the quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt for three years.

Prior to Rahne's time at Vanderbilt, the program had been to four bowl games in 121 years of football, none in consecutive seasons. The Commodores were ranked in the Top-25 in the final polls in 2012 and 2013 marking the first time they were ranked in back-to-back seasons in program history.

He spent five years at Kansas State, starting as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching the running backs and tight ends. He helped the Wildcats to two bowl appearances.

Rahne started his coaching career on the defensive side at Holy Cross coaching the defensive line. The following year he coached the running backs at his alma mater, Cornell.

He was a three-year starter at quarterback at Cornell (2002), and graduated as the Big Red's all-time leader in completions (678), passing yards (7,710), touchdown passes (54) and total offense (7,994). He was inducted into the Cornell Hall of Fame in 2014.

Rahne and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Ryder and Jake.

Henderson Tackling Records

Linebacker Jason Henderson has already toppled two records so far this season, he now looks ahead to two more on a bigger scale.

Henderson notched 18 more tackles this past Saturday against James Madison, his 10th double-digit tackle game of the season.

The NCAA FBS records for tackles and tackles per game are within reach. The single-season record for tackles in a season is 193, set by Texas Tech's Lawrence Flugence in 2002. The record for tackles per game is held by Boston College's Luke Kuechly, who averaged 15.9 tackles per game in 2011.

Henderson is 27 tackles shy of tying Flugence, and currently is averaging 16.6 tackles per game.

He has tied or led ODU in tackles all 10 games this season and has reached double figures in all 10 games

Henderson is the only FBS player with two 20+ tackle game on the season. He notched 21 tackles against Arkansas State to set the ODU single-game record and broke it a month later with 22 stops against Georgia Southern.

Henderson was named a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award given to the Outstanding Defensive Player in the country. He was one of just two semifinalists from a Group of Five program. The other was Cincinnati's Ivan Pace Jr.

Henderson finished the 2021 season with 80 tackles in 12 games.

Wide receiver Ali Jennings is out for the remainder of the season, but the Richmond native had a standout season that ranks in the top-10 nationally in several categories.

Jennings leads the Sun Belt Conference with 959 receiving yards and in yards per game with 106.5 yards per game. He is third in the country in yards per game behind only Rashee Rice of SMU and Jalin Hyatt of Tennessee. He ranks eighth in the country with nine touchdown catches and 10th in receiving yards.

- Completed 12-of-22 passes for a season-low 112 yards and two interceptions against JMU. Rank for a career-high 27 yards and was ODU's leading rusher.
- Was 24-of-46 for 198 yards and an INT against Marshall
- Completed 19-of-35 passes for 257 yards, two touchdowns and a pick at Georgia State.
- Had streak of 132 passes without an INT snapped on his final pass of the game at GSU.
- Was 23-of-40 for 313 yards and a TD last week against Georgia Southern.
- Completed 12-of-16 passes for 180 yards and two scores in win at Coastal. The 16 pass attempts are fewest this season.
- Ran for eight-yard touchdown against LU, the first of his career.
- Completed 27-of-46 passes for season-high 297 yards and two touchdowns against Liberty. His first quarter interception was deflected and snapped a streak of 80-straight passes without an INT.
- Went 19-for-32 with 279 yards and two touchdowns in 29-26 win over Arkansas State.
- Led ODU to scoring drives at the end of the first half and second half. Threw 18-yard TD pass to Zack Kuntz to put ODU up 14-13.
- Was 23-of-37 for 235 yards and two TDs at Virginia.
- Completed 18-of-30 with three TDs and one INT for 275 yards in loss at ECU. Sacked four times and lost a fumble

Anthony has played in 45 career games and started 21. In his Monarch career he has 27 receptions for 281 yards.

Tyre Bibby – DT – Miami, Fla./American Senior/Coffeyville

A two-year starter on the defensive line, Bibby has gone unnoticed as he gobbles up blockers so Jason Henderson can run free. He has played in 35 games, starting 21. He has 43 career tackles, including 15 this season.

Damion Charity – CB – Hampton, Va./Phoebus

Charity has established himself as a key special teams player for ODU, playing in 27 career games. He started one game at cornerback last year and secured 17 tackles.

Tobias Harris – CB – Pflugerville, Texas/Hendrickson/West Texas A&M

A two-time Division II All-American at West Texas A&M, Harris has started all nine games at cornerback for the Monarchs. He leads ODU with 10 pass breakups and recorded an interception in the win over Virginia Tech. He leads all active college football players with 18 career interceptions.

Tre Hawkins – CB – Temple, Texas/Trinity Valley

A two-year starter at corner, Hawkins has started 23 games at ODU. He is sixth on the team in tackles with 48 and has been all over the stat sheet this season. He has two interceptions, six pass breakups, a forced fumble, a blocked kick, and is second in the country with three fumble recoveries. He earned All-C-USA honorable mention accolades last year.

Marcus Haynes – DE – Bowie, Md./Bowie/Fork Union

Haynes has started all nine games at defensive end for the Monarchs, recording a career-high 41 tackles, and has 5.5 tackles for loss and three sacks. He is the active leader on the team with 15 career sacks.

Ryan Henry – LB – Miami, Fla./Miami Southridge/ASA College

Ryan Henry is fifth on the squad with 51 tackles, second in tackles for loss with 7.5 and tied for the team lead in sacks with four. Over the last three years at ODU, Henry has 131 career tackles. He earned All-C-USA honorable mention accolades last year.

Colten Hicks – S – Poquoson, Va./Poquoson

This year, Mack has played in five games in certain packages, rushing for 33 yards and a touchdown at Coastal Carolina, and also tossing a 21-yard touchdown at Coastal.

John Morton – LS/H – Ashburn, Va./Stone Bridge

Morton has appeared in all but one game the last two years as ODU's holder. He also stepped in last season as the primary long snapper on punts. He recovered a fumble last season at Liberty.

Aaron Moore – WR – Dumfries, Va./Potomac

Moore holds the ODU single-game record for receptions, when he caught 14 passes for 194 yards at Middle Tennessee in 2019. For his career, Moore has 27 receptions for 398 yards and three touchdowns.

Austin Mosier – OL – Piscataway, N.J./Piscataway

A four-year member of the Monarchs, Mosier has been the backup center this season.

Brandon Ruff – OL – Bedford, Va./Liberty

Ruff suffered a career-ending injury but has stayed with the program as a student assistant coach for the last two seasons.

Nick Saldiveri – OL – Waxhaw, N.C./Parkwood

A three-year starter on the offensive line, Saldiveri has started 34 games in his career, including 33 at right tackle and earlier this year made a start at right guard. In the regular season finale last season against Charlotte, he recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. He earned All-C-USA honorable mention accolades last year.

Dominik Soos – K – Budapest, Hungary/St. Mary's HS/CC of San Francisco

ODU's kickoff specialist the last two years, Soos has delivered touchbacks on 36 percent of his kickoffs, going 36-for-98.

Isaiah Spencer – TE – Gloucester, Va./Gloucester

Spencer has played in all 10 games this season and made five starts at tight end. He has 15 catches for 141 yards and a touchdown. In 30 career games, Spencer has 33 catches for 356 yards and three touchdowns. He blocked a punt that was returned for a touchdown last season at UTEP.

Blake Watson – RB – Queens, N.Y./Green Hope (N.C.)

Watson has 129 carries for 734 yards and five touchdowns so far this season. He ranks fourth in the Sun Belt and 31st in the country with 89 yards per game. He became just the second player in program history to rush for more than 1,000 yards, when he rushed for 1,112 yards last season. Watson has rushed for 1,962 yards on 369 carries, ranking third and fourth respectively in those categories in program history.

Steven Williams – LB – Washington, D.C./Woodrow Wilson

Once the second youngest player to ever start an FBS game at quarterback, Steven Williams currently had 26 tackles as a linebacker for the 2022 Monarchs. Williams has started games at quarterback, wide receiver and linebacker in his ODU career, dating back to 2017. He has 2,083 passing yards, 263 rushing yards, 167 receiving yards and 48 tackles and an interception in his career.

Game One Recap • Old Dominion 20 Virginia Tech 17

Late Drive Lifts ODU over Virginia Tech, 20-17

NORFOLK, Va. – Lightning does strike twice.

Quarterback Hayden Wolff engineered a dramatic Old Dominion rally in the final three minutes, leading the Monarchs on a 74-yard touch-down drive that gave ODU a 20-17 victory over Virginia Tech.

The victory comes four years after the Monarchs upended the Hokies, 49-35, at old Foreman Field in the biggest victory in ODU football history.

That victory was ODU's first over a Power 5 school and Tech was ranked 13th nationally. This Tech team is rebuilding and ODU has a veteran team. The Hokies were only 6-point favorites whereas they were 29-point favorites four years ago.

But beating a program that has won four ACC titles, has the largest following in the state and played for a national championship was the most consequential victory in coach Ricky Rahne's tenure at ODU.

The game was witnessed by a sellout crowd of 21,944, the largest since 2019 at S.B. Ballard Stadium, and the crowd was electric. At game's end, most of the nearly 5,000 ODU students in attendance charged the field and celebrated with the players.

The game itself wasn't artful. Tech quarterback Grant Wells had four passes intercepted, and ODU scored its first touchdown when a Hokie long snapper hiked an attempted field goal over the head of the holder.

The ball bounded 56 yards to the Tech 25, where cornerback Robert Kennedy III scooped it up and ran for the touchdown.

ODU had just 245 offensive yards, and half came in the fourth quarter, while Virginia Tech had 14 penalties.

"There were plays available all night and we just didn't make them," Rahne said. "That's fine. That happens sometimes. But at the end, Hayden Wolff made some huge plays."

Tech led, 17-10, when the Monarchs had only their second sustained drive of the game, marching from the Tech 48 to the 3 before settling for an Ethan Sanchez 20-yard field goal, the second of the game for the freshman from Dallas, Georgia.

Wolff completed a 27-yard pass to Ali Jennings III on the big play of that drive to foreshadow what would be a dramatic end to the game.

Tech was milking the clock and driving into ODU territory, when line-backer Ryan Henry intercepted a Wells pass at the ODU 41. A personal foul drove the ball back to the 26, and with 2:58 to go, the Monarchs had to score a touchdown to win.

Wolff found Jennings for 24 yards on the first play, and the crowd was on its feet the rest of the game.

Facing fourth and 1, offensive coordinator Kevin Reihner called on senior running back Blake Watson to get the first down, and he bulled past a linebacker to keep the drive alive.

Watson's stats – 19 carries for 56 yards and a touchdown – weren't spectacular, but most of his yards came as he dragged Hokies with him.

On third and 7 from the 39, Wolff found Jennings on the left side of the field, a yard short of a touchdown, with a minute left to play.

ODU then milked the clock, forcing Tech to burn two timeouts, before Watson carried for the touchdown on second down.

Tech had 37 seconds left to get into field goal range, but LaMareon James, the sophomore from Indian River High School, intercepted Wells on third down to clinch the victory.

ODU Falls at ECU, 39-21

GREENVILLE, N.C. – For three quarters, Old Dominion's defense kept the Monarchs in the game. Every time they absolutely had to have a stop, the defense came through, and entering the fourth quarter, ODU trailed East Carolina by a single score, 22-14.

But then the Monarch D finally ran out of the gas.

Two minutes into the fourth quarter, tailback Keaton Mitchell burst for an 81-yard touchdown run that gave the Pirates all the momentum they needed. They scored twice more and led, 39-14, before settling for a 39-21 victory before a rain-soaked Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium crowd announced of 36,853.

In the process, ECU (1-1) salvaged some of the pain from a 21-20 loss to No. 13 North Carolina State last weekend. That was a game the Pirates dominated, but lost because of a blocked punt, blocked extra point and a shanked game-winning field goal attempt.

ODU (1-1) was coming off one of its most significant victories ever, a come-from-behind, 20-17, upset of Virginia Tech last weekend at home.

Sophomore linebacker Jason Henderson, who led ODU with 14 tackles, said the Monarchs had something of a hangover following the victory over the Hokies.

ECU showed little hangover from their crushing loss. The Pirates played with emotion and played well. Quarterback Holton Ahlers, a fourth-year starter who will break most of ECU's passing records this season, was superb, completing 25 of 39 passes for 270 yards and two touchdowns.

ODU quarterback Hayden Wolff played far better than he did in the victory over Virginia Tech, completing 18 of 29 passes for 271 yards and three touchdowns with one interception. He threw eight completions to wide receiver Ali Jennings III, who had 196 receiving yards and all three touchdowns.

But the Monarchs were unable to mount any sustained drives or get their running game in gear. ODU finished with just 15 rushing yards. Standout running back Blake Watson had just 45 yards on five carries.

Trailing, 16-7, after a first half in which the Monarch offense struggled mightily, the Monarchs exploded on the first possession of the second half for 75 yards and a touchdown on just five plays. Wolff completed two passes for 61 yards to Jennings, including an 18-yard TD pass in which Wolff's head fake caught the ECU defensive backs off guard.

Ethan Sanchez's PAT trimmed the ECU lead to 16-14.

Midway through the third quarter, ECU went for it on fourth down and inches to go at the ODU 28. Henderson tackled tailback Rahjai Harris short of the first down, ending the scoring threat.

Late in the third quarter, on a drive aided by a pass interference penalty, Harris just nudged the ball across the goal line on a 3-yard shovel pass from Ahlers.

ODU's Devin Brandt-Epps blocked the extra point, the second blocked extra point of the game for the Monarchs, and ECU led, 22-14.

Game Three Recap - Virginia 16 Old Dominion 14

ODU Falls at UVA on Last Second Field Goal

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. – Old Dominion was 61 seconds away from what would have been one of its most storied football victories ever.

The Monarchs silenced a Scott Stadium crowd of 40,556 with an 11-play, 80-yard drive, capped by Hayden Wolff's 18-yard touchdown pass to Zack Kuntz, that gave the Monarchs a 14-13 lead over Virginia with 1:01 left.

For a few moments, the 2,000 or so Monarch fans in attendance held court, as their shouts of "ODU" reverberated around the stadium while Virginia's fans watched in stunned silence.

But led by standout quarterback Brennan Armstrong, the Cavaliers drove 56 yards in the final minute to set up a 26-yard field goal from Brendan Farrell that gave Virginia a 16-14 victory.

Kuntz, who is 6-foot-8, lined up on the extra-point block team and the kick sailed a foot or two above his outstretched hands.

A victory would have given ODU (1-2) a clean sweep of the state's two ACC schools. The Monarchs upset Virginia Tech, 20-17, in their season opener two weeks ago.

It was a heartbreaking way to lose, but coach Ricky Rahne said in the end, every loss hurts.

Armstrong (20 of 37 passes for 284 yards) became Virginia's all-time leading passer.

Wolff played perhaps his best game of 2022, completing 23 of 37 passes for 235 yards and two touchdowns

But the Monarchs were unable to mount sustained drives and the running game, while more productive than it was last week at East Carolina, produced just 89 net yards.

ODU's other touchdown came on a 32-second, 64-yard drive at the end of the first half, in which Wolff completed a 28-yard TD pass to Ali Jennings III.

ODU surrendered 513 yards, but its defense kept the Monarchs in the game by forcing and recovering fumbles on three Virginia drives into the red zone.

"This one really hurts," Wolff said. "Our defense played against a top NFL draft quarterback, and they played lights out. They forced turnovers, they gave us opportunities.

ODU began its last drive on the Virginia 20 and twice converted on fourth down. The first came on a 22-yard pass to Kuntz that gave ODU a first down at its 44.

Then, on fourth and 15 at the Virginia 33, Wolff passed to an open Jennings, who was dragged down by a Cavaliers' defender before he could haul in the pass. A pass interference penalty gave ODU a first down at the 18.

Two plays later, Wolff connected with Kuntz for the touchdown.

Virginia's Nick Jackson caught the ensuing kickoff deep in the end zone and generally, players settle for a touchback when they are that deep.

But he returned the kick and found a seam that gave Virginia a first down at the 37.

Armstrong then threw a 30-yard pass to Lavel Davis Jr. and the Cavaliers were in business.

ODU hosts Arkansas State Saturday at 6 p.m. in its first Sun Belt Conference game ever. The Monarchs must quickly put aside Saturday's loss, Rahne said.

ODU Wins First Sun Belt Game, 29-26 Over Arkansas State

NORFOLK, Va. – Old Dominion won its first Sun Belt Conference football game Saturday night in memorable fashion.

The Monarch defense forced two second-half turnovers that led to touchdowns, and ODU twice rallied from second-half deficits, to claim a 29-26 victory over Arkansas State before a boisterous crowd of 20,655 at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Defensive end Deeve Harris, a transfer from Minnesota, returned an interception 16 yards for a touchdown late in the third quarter that briefly gave ODU a 21-19 lead.

Then late in the fourth, with Arkansas State leading, 26-21, safety Terry Jones forced a fumble recovered by defensive tackle Tyre Bibby that led to the game-winner.

The fumble recovery gave ODU a first down at the 29. On fourth down and 3 at the 23, ODU quarterback Hayden Wolff threw a pass intended for Javon Harvey, who was pulled down by Arkansas State defensive back Kenneth Harris. That drew a flag for pass interference.

That gave ODU a first down at the seven. Wolff then passed to tight end Zack Kuntz for the touchdown.

ODU went for two and Obie Sanni, the 5-foot-9, 196-pound redshirt freshman from Aurora, Colorado broke a tackle to give the Monarchs a 29-26 lead with 6:33 left.

ODU then needed two stops from its defense and got them.

On fourth down and two at the Arkansas State 40, a pass from quarterback James Blackman fell incomplete.

Arkansas State regained possession in the final minute at its own two after a 38-yard punt by Ethan Duane but could not move the ball. On the game's final play, a desperation pass led to two laterals and then a fumble.

ODU (2-2 overall, 1-0 Sun Belt) mustered just 126 offensive yards in a first half in which the Monarchs only came close to scoring once, when freshman Ethan Sanchez missed a 48-yard field goal.

ODU began the second half by driving 78 yards in five plays as Kuntz (34 yards) and Ali Jennings III (33) each hauled in long passes. Jennings' catch was originally ruled a touchdown, but after review, the ball was placed at the one.

Keshawn Wicks, the redshirt freshman from Moncks Corner, South Carolina, scored on the next play.

Arkansas State retaliated quickly with Blackman finding wide receiver Jeff Foreman on a 49-yard touchdown pass, which gave the Red Wolves a 19-7 lead.

ODU again quickly responded, with Wolff finding Jennings with a 77-yard touchdown pass, the longest play of the season.

ODU's defense, which has forced a ton of turnovers this season, then forced the first of two. With defensive end Marcus Haynes hanging onto him, Blackman threw a pass intercepted by Harris, who returned it 16 yards for a touchdown.

It was the second interception of his career and third career TD. A Sanchez PAT gave ODU a 21-19 lead.

The lead was short-lived, as the Red Wolves drove 60 yards, with AJ Mayer scoring from 23 yards to with 12:10 left.

ODU's defense then stepped up again forcing a fumble that led to the game-winner.

Linebacker Jason Henderson broke a school record with 21 tackles and linebacker Ryan Henry added 12. The Monarchs had seven sacks, each by a different player.

Liberty Pulls Away Late for 38-24 Win Over Old Dominion

NORFOLK, Va. – On a night when Old Dominion’s offense came alive, and quarterback Hayden Wolff showed off both his running and passing skills, the Monarchs beat themselves with mistakes.

Liberty scored late in the third quarter and on a 99-yard drive in the fourth quarter, kept alive by two key ODU penalties, to claim a 38-24 victory over the Monarchs Saturday night.

Trailing, 38-24, with less four minutes left, ODU had a goal-line stand and then watched Liberty miss a field goal. The Monarchs drove from their 20 to the Liberty 16 with 28 seconds left.

However, Wolff attempted to pass, while being hit by a Liberty defender, and it was ruled a fumble that Liberty recovered.

Wolff completed 27 of 46 passes for 297 yards and two touchdowns. ODU’s offense, which has struggled much of the season, had a season-high 419 yards and the run game, which had really struggled, produced 118 yards. That number would have been higher if you subtracted four Liberty sacks.

Wolff breathed life into ODU’s offense not just with his passing arm but also his feet. After Liberty took the 14-0 lead, he led ODU on a 75-yard drive, and scored when he faked a handoff to the left and ran eight yards for the TD around the right end.

Wolff kept a brilliant drive alive in the third quarter in which he scrambled three times for 20 yards and connected with Blake Watson on a 16-yard touchdown pass, which knotted the score at 24-all.

ODU (2-3 overall) ends the non-conference portion of its schedule having beaten expectations, but having come so close to much more. Liberty (4-1), an independent, lost only to Wake Forest when a Flames’ two-point conversion failed.

The Monarchs set up two Liberty touchdowns in a bizarre first quarter when two passes bounced off their hands.

One came on what looked like a sure interception that bounced into the hands of Liberty receiver CJ Yarbrough, who then scampered the final 10 yards of a 41-yard touchdown pass.

Another came with a pass from Wolff bounced off a receiver’s hands and was intercepted by Robert Rahimi, which set up a 34-yard, acrobatic one-handed touchdown grab by Jaivian Lofton on the next play, which gave Liberty a 7-0 lead.

ODU trailed, 31-24, early in the fourth quarter, and appeared certain to get the ball back in great field position after a Liberty pass fell incomplete on third down at the Flames’ four.

But ODU was called for holding, which kept the drive alive. The Flames ended up driving 99 yards and bleeding four minutes off the clock to take a 38-24 lead.

On its next possession, Wolff completed a 24-yard pass to Javon Harvey on fourth and 23 that would have given ODU a first down at its 48. But it was negated by a holding penalty. Rushed by Liberty defenders, Wolff’s pass on the next play was incomplete.

ODU had 14 penalties for 120 yards. Although several penalties appeared to be controversial, and the crowd of 18,368 often booed the referees, Rahne called the penalties ‘self-inflicted wounds.’

Game Six Recap: ODU 49 CCU 21

ODU Shuts Down Coastal, 49-21

CONWAY, S.C. – Picked by coaches to finish last in the Sun Belt Conference's powerful East Division, Old Dominion's football team nonetheless sits atop the East standings at the midpoint of the season.

ODU's offense exploded for 35 points in the second half and blew past previously unbeaten Coastal Carolina, 49-21 in front of a stunned homecoming crowd of 16,814 at Brooks Stadium.

Coastal and James Madison had been tied for the Sun Belt lead, each at 3-0 in league play. But ODU (3-3 overall, 2-0 Sun Belt) moved into first place after Georgia Southern upset JMU, 45-38, Saturday night.

Coastal (3-1, 6-1) had won 28 of its last 31 games and was unbeaten in six games this season.

Running back Blake Watson was ODU's offensive hero. The 5-foot-9, redshirt junior from Queens, New York, set the school record previously held by Thomas DeMarco by rushing for 256 yards on 18 carries. He also scored three touchdowns. His 14.2 yards per carry is also an ODU record.

It was the second signature victory for ODU televised on ESPNU. The Monarchs upset Virginia Tech, 20-17, in their home opener.

The victory ended a nine-game Coastal winning streak.

Coming off a bye week, the Monarchs solved whatever ailed their offense and rolled to a season-high 525 yards. Each time Coastal pulled within striking distance, the Monarch offense would retaliate.

Offensive coordinator Kevin Reihner added some wrinkles to his offense, including subbing in backup quarterback D.J. Mack several times, and that appeared to catch the Chanticleers off guard.

Mack rushed 20 yards for a touchdown early in the third quarter and then passed 21 yards to tight end Isaiah Spencer eight minutes later.

ODU led, 14-7 at the half before blowing open the game in the second half.

Rahne said the Monarchs set the tone for the game on the opening drive, when they drove 73 yards in eight plays capped by Watson's 25-yard touchdown run.

As if to punctuate that point, on Watson's final touchdown of the game, a 67-yard rush with 10:16 left that gave ODU a 21-point lead, wide receiver Javon Harvey hustled down the field and used his body to shade Watson from two defenders as he ran the last 10 yards.

The first TD of the second half was set up by a fumble caused and recovered by Tre Hawkins, which led to a 69-yard drive capped by Mack's 20-yard TD run.

Then came a fourth-down stand by ODU's defense that seemed to knock the life out of Coastal. On fourth and one from the ODU 49, Coastal Carolina went for the first down. But defensive end Marcus Haynes sacked quarterback Grayson McCall for a 10-yard loss.

ODU then drove 41 yards in 54 seconds, with Isiah Paige catching a 22-yard TD pass from quarterback Hayden Wolff that gave ODU a 28-7 lead.

Wolff also played well, completing 12 of 16 passes for 180 yards and two touchdowns.

Coastal twice cut the lead to 14, but each time, the Monarchs responded, with Watson's running for 67-yard touchdown run all but sealing the victory.

Game Seven Recap: GS 28 ODU 23

ODU Falls to Georgia Southern, 28-23

NORFOLK, Va. – Coming off perhaps their biggest victory of the season, a road game in which Old Dominion's football team was absolutely dominant at previously unbeaten Coastal Carolina, the Monarchs fell at home to Georgia Southern 28-23 on Saturday night at Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

ODU narrowed what had been a 21-10 lead to five, 28-23, on Blake Watson's two-yard touchdown run with 5:19 left. But the Monarchs were unable to stop the Georgia Southern offense until 32 seconds remained, and it simply wasn't enough time for ODU to march nearly the length of the field.

ODU outgained Georgia Southern, 461-415, but the Eagles made the tough plays when they were needed.

Georgia Southern scored touchdowns on its two drives into the red zone. ODU was 3 of 5, but two of the scores were field goals.

Hayden Wolff played well at quarterback for ODU, completing 23 of 40 passes for 328 yards and a touchdown. Wide receiver Ali Jennings III, who is having an outstanding season, hauled in nine passes for 130 yards and a touchdown.

Tailback Blake Watson, who set a single-game rushing record at Coastal Carolina, rushed 16 times for 108 yards and a touchdown.

ODU linebacker Jason Henderson continued to have what looks like an All-American season. The sophomore tied his own school record of 22 tackles and is averaging 16 per game.

But the only stat that mattered in this game was the final score. The loss knocked ODU out of first place in the Sun Belt.

Trailing 21-10, late in the third quarter, ODU slowly began to chip away the lead.

Freshman placekicker Ethan Sanchez, who missed two field goal attempts in the first half, trimmed the lead to 21-13 with a 35-yarder with 2:27 left in the third quarter.

Then a botched punt snap by Georgia Southern gave ODU possession on the Eagles' 16.

ODU appeared to score when Jennings hauled in a 16-yard, third-down pass that refs said he did not control completely before going out of bounds.

The Monarchs called on Sanchez one more time and he drilled a 33-yard field goal with 21 seconds left in the third quarter that narrowed the margin to 21-16.

But Georgia Southern's offense responded, driving 76 yards for a touchdown capped by a Gerald Green 3-yard TD run that ran the margin back to 12, 28-16, with 10 minutes left.

ODU's offense then again responded, driving 67 yards on a drive kept alive when Wolff found Jennings for an eight-yard pass on fourth down at the 40. Watson then bulled into the end zone and Sanchez drilled the PAT to make it 28-23 with 5:19 left.

But on fourth down and 1 on the ODU 37 and 2:38 on the clock, Vantrease got just enough yardage for a first down.

Georgia Southern turned over the ball on downs with 32 seconds left but out of timeouts, the ODU offense was unable to move the ball.

Game Eight Recap: GSU 31 ODU 17

ODU Falls at Georgia State, 31-17

ATLANTA, Ga. – Shorn of much of its depth by injuries, Old Dominion's defense could not stop Georgia State quarterback Darren Grainger, the offense could not move the ball with any consistency and the Monarchs lost a game they really needed to win.

Grainger passed for 195 yards and ran for another 109 as the Panthers beat the Monarchs, 31-17 Saturday afternoon on a cool, blustery day at Center Parc Stadium.

Cornerback Tre Hawkins III, who blocked a field goal and recovered a fumble, said coach Ricky Rahn spoke shortly but bluntly to the team after the game.

Grainger led Georgia State to two first-half touchdowns with 173 passing and 34 rushing yards, and it might have been worse had Hawkins not recovered a fumble at the ODU 7 and blocked a 38-yard field goal attempt.

Grainger quickly asserted control in the third quarter, with a little help from the Monarchs.

The Monarchs ran into punter Michael Hayes on fourth and two five minutes into the second half and that kept alive a drive that would end after 80 yards with the go-ahead touchdown.

Grainger kept the drive alive with runs of 15 and 17 yards, and then ran a yard for the touchdown with five minutes left in the third quarter and Georgia State led, 21-14.

Wolff was then sacked and fumbled at the Monarch 11, and it took Georgia State just one play, an 11-yard jaunt by tailback Marcus Carroll, to give the Panthers a 28-14 lead.

After again forcing ODU to punt, the Panthers drained nearly 10 minutes off the clock and made it 31-14 on a 26-yard field by Michael Hayes with 6:20 left.

Thanks in large part by a 54-yard pass from Wolff to Harvey, ODU finally scored in the second half when Ethan Sanchez booted a 40-yarder with 4:51 left.

ODU then tried an on-side which was recovered by Georgia State. A final ODU drive was snuffed out by an interception by Georgia State's Justin Abraham. The interception snapped Wolff's streak of passes without an interception at 132.

ODU took an early 7-0 lead on a 61-yard touchdown pass to Harvey on what would be the longest offensive play of the game.

ODU's defense killed one Georgia State drive in the red zone when Robert Kennedy III forced a fumble that was recovered by Hawkins. But ODU's offense could not move the ball and a Tallique Williams 28-yard punt return set up a 4-yard touchdown run by Tucker Gregg.

Georgia State then retook the lead on a well-designed play in which Grainger, while on the run around his right end, threw to an open Jamari Thrash, who ambled into the end zone for a 38-yard touchdown.

Minutes later, ODU drove 75 yards in seven plays, with Wolff finding Ali Jennings III on a 12-yard touchdown pass with 7:15 left in the first half to tie the score at 14.

Georgia State appeared poised to retake the lead, driving from its 32 to the ODU 22 before a drive stalled. Hawkins again came up big again, blocking an attempted 38-yard field goal with 1:51 left.

But in the second half, Georgia State outgained ODU 166-66.

Game Nine Recap: Marshall 12 ODU 0

Marshall Shuts Out ODU, 12-0

NORFOLK, Va. – Faced with the unenviable task of scoring against the Sun Belt Conference's best defense, Old Dominion's offense struggled mightily at S.B. Ballard Stadium Saturday.

Unable to get its ground game going, and stymied by four turnovers, the Monarchs were shut out for the first time in five years. Marshall rode the leg of freshman placekicker Rece Verhoff, who made four of five field goal attempts, to claim a 12-0 victory.

ODU had not been shut out since Sept. 23, 2017, when the Monarchs fell to No. 13 Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, 38-0. The loss was the third in a row for ODU (3-6, 2-3 Sun Belt).

ODU was outgained, 387-209, although the Herd padded the total late in the game on a 41-yard by run Marshall quarterback Cam Fancher. The 209 yards was a season low for the Monarchs.

Quarterback Hayden Wolff completed 24 of 46 passes for 198 yards and one interception. He was sacked three times.

Only a heroic effort by ODU's defense kept this game relatively close. The Monarch defense was on the field for 38 minutes and 11 seconds, almost 17 minutes less than the offense. Marshall had 81 offensive plays to ODU's 60.

ODU trailed, 6-0, at the half, when the Herd marched nine plays for 63 yards to the Monarch 15, where on fourth down, the ODU defense held Marshall a yard away from a first down.

The Herd was forced to call on Verhoff to kick his third field goal of the day, this one from 30 yards, that made it 9-0.

ODU's offense then turned the ball over at the 50, when wide receiver Javon Harvey gathered in a pass from Wolff but was stripped of the ball by Marshall's Kerion Martin and the Herd recovered.

ODU's defense then stood tall again as Tobias Harris knocked a ball away from a Marshall receiver and into the hands of Tre Hawkins in the end zone.

The Monarch offense then coughed up the ball one more time, as Wolff's pass up the middle was intercepted by linebacker Abraham Beauplan and returned seven yards to the ODU 24.

Again, the defense held, as Verhoff kicked a field goal, this one from 23 yards, that made it 12-0 with 10:50 to go.

Verhoff finally missed, when he had a 41-yard attempt blocked by Chazz Wallace, with 6:26 left.

Early on the defense forced the Herd to kick two field goals while inside the red zone, and then forced a turnover to end another first-half scoring threat.

Marshall scored a minute into the second quarter after driving 76 yards on 14 plays. The drive stalled when Khaleen Laborn, the senior from Virginia Beach, was stacked up five yards short of a first down by E.J. Green and Jason Henderson.

Verhoff then booted a 33-yard field goal.

ODU then turned the ball over as D.J. Mack Jr. fumbled while being tackled by Owen Porter. It was recovered by Andre Sam and returned 22 yards to the ODU 20.

But four plays later, Fancher was forced out of bounds at the 8 on third and goal, and again, the Herd was forced to settle for a Verhoff field goal, this one from 26 yards.

Game 10 Recap: JMU 37 ODU 3

JMU Tops ODU, 37-3

NORFOLK, Va. – Old Dominion and James Madison renewed their football rivalry Saturday for the first time in a decade in the 72nd Oyster Bowl. And on a day when the Monarchs were without their top two offensive playmakers, the Monarchs simply could not get their offense going.

JMU rolled to a 37-3 victory at S.B. Ballard Stadium in the first meeting between the schools since 2012 and their first ever in the Sun Belt Conference.

ODU lost tight end Zack Kuntz to an injury earlier this season and wide receiver Ali Jennings III, one of the nation's top pass receivers, also did not play. In his post-game press conference, ODU coach Ricky Rahne confirmed news reports that Jennings needs surgery and is done for the season.

Quarterback Hayden Wolff was under pressure much of the game and scrambled far more than usual, rushing for 43 yards on five carries. He was sacked four times for negative 21 yards. He completed 12-of-22 passes for 112 yards with two interceptions.

JMU quarterback Todd Centeio completed 18-of-21 passes for 304 yards and ran for 17 more and a touchdown was named the Mel Blassingham Oyster Bowl MVP.

JMU led, 14-0, after dominating the first 16 minutes and 11 seconds in which the Dukes outgained the Monarchs 176-26.

ODU mounted a threat on its next possession, in which Wolff twice scrambled for gains after being rushed from the pocket, including one on a fourth down, and hit freshman Ahmarian Granger with a 23-yard pass.

On fourth down, Javon Harvey hauled in a 19-yard pass that referees at first ruled was long enough for a first down. However, after an official review, he was marked a yard short, and the ball turned over to JMU.

The Dukes then extended the lead to 17-0 on a 33-yard field from Camden Wise.

ODU's defense then set up the offense nicely with 1:21 left in the half when Steven Williams Jr., the sixth-year linebacker playing his final game at S.B. Ballard Stadium, intercepted a pass and returned it 17 yards to the JMU 31. He was stripped of the ball while being tackled but linebacker Jason Henderson recovered.

The drive stalled on third and three at the 12, when a pass intended for Granger was broken up by Jalin Walker. Freshmen placekicker Ethan Sanchez then kicked a 29-yard field goal with five seconds left in the half to narrow the margin to 17-3.

ODU cornerback R'Tarriun Johnson, another senior playing his last home game, intercepted a pass on the second play of the second half and returned it 30 yards to the JMU 40. But he was stripped of the ball while being tackled and it was recovered by JMU's Percy Agyei-Obese.

The Dukes followed with a 21-yard Wise field goal with 8:20 left in the third quarter to make it 20-3.

JMU's Walker then intercepted a Wolff pass and returned it 29 yards for a touchdown and gave JMU a 27-3 lead.

Henderson, the sophomore from Dingmans Ferry, Pennsylvania, had 18 tackles and set the Sun Belt Conference single season tackling record with 166 tackles.
